The islands of Malta and Gozo impart an intense awareness of the history of Europe, but also of a psychosocial sensibility which even today seems to influence our self-perception as Europeans.

A phenomenon on Malta is the fervent Catholicism which continues to be lavishly nurtured and celebrated. Omnipresent is the legacy of the Knights of Malta - an aggressive military order, also known as The Order of St. John. Malta is dominated by the extensive fortifications erected by the Knights. Dense building areas, dense population, dense car traffic – typical for Malta and Europe.

For many boat refugees from Africa, Malta is the point of arrival today. How "Fortress Europe" "defends" itself against immigrants from Africa has parallels to the way in which the Christian powers in the Mediterranean defended themselves against the Turks and the Arabs from the 16th to 18th century.
